EDI – Early Development Instrument Assessment of School Readiness at the Community Level

 - **Do school districts have to fund their own EDI assessment?** No, private and public funders are being approached to get this system of school readiness up and running
 - **Is this assessment done on a sample of kindergarten children or all kindergarten children?** All children are included so that every neighborhood can get a complete picture of how their children are doing and where the gaps are
 - **Is it possible to get EDI scores for individual children?** NO, the EDI is not designed for reporting on individual children, but is designed to measure how groups of children in neighborhoods are doing on five domains of childhood development.
